A MOST CRUCIAL ELECTION

November 2 is a most crucial election day! A pro-life voter's highest priority is following the pro-life principle that the direct and intentional killing of innocent human life is always wrong and is always non-negotiable. A pro-lifer should vote for the candidate who will best

advance pro-life principles and must withhold their vote from a candidate who will do the most to harm this principle. Our nation's abortion policies today:

- result in death for millions of innocent children
- violate our nation's founding principles and jeopardize the future of our nation.
- test our faithfulness as people of God to follow His command to "Love thy neighbor as thyself."

We wish to restate that the intentional destruction of innocent human life, as in abortion and euthanasia, is not just one issue among many. All issues are not morally equivalent. The protection of human life from conception until natural death is the preeminent obligation of a truly just society. Abortion is an intrinsic evil. Support for an intrinsic evil disqualifies a candidate for public office. Intrinsically evil actions are those that fundamentally conflict with the moral law and can never be performed under any circumstances or for any reasons.

We must be "single issue voters" when that issue involves a fundamental right to life for a certain group of human beings, and there is only one morally legitimate position on that issue. For example, no person would vote for a candidate who, although "personally opposed to slavery," supported "a white man's right to choose" to own slaves. Similarly, we have a moral obligation to withhold our vote from any candidate who, although "personally opposed to abortion," supports: a woman's right to choose" to have her child killed before birth by abortion.

The right to life of all human beings is at the heart of all morality and the foundation of justice, which is the fundamental purpose of civil law. The protection of this right no more advances one religious viewpoint than do laws against murder, child abuse, racial discrimination, theft, etc. "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brethren, you do unto me." Matthew 25:40.

To help pro-life voters know the pro-life candidate LIFEPAC was formed in 1980 as an independent Political Action Committee. It is not a part of any political party or church. Their mission is to identify and support pro-life candidates. LIFEPAC can do things legally that churches may not. LIFEPAC include churches as part of the distribution efforts due to the fact that there are a higher majority of people that care about the sanctity of life among people of faith than the population as a whole. Since the church cannot endorse any candidates, but the people in the pews need this valuable information, many volunteers leaflet LIFEPAC flyers on cars in church parking lots. However, neither legally or to conform to their own church policy are the churches obligated to chase away those who are informing parishioners as to which candidates are pro-life.

In recent years neither the IRS regulations on what churches can or cannot do, nor the Catholic Churches Policies have changed. The only thing that has changed is that some Diocesan officials have decided to become more pro-active in suppressing information from LIFEPAC. As individuals we will continue to try and serve other people of faith by distributing information important to the vast majority in a way that the church itself cannot.

No legal obligation exists to prevent third-party literature distribution on Church parking lots. No church can lose its tax exemption for what a third party does. This distribution is not only compliant with existing civil laws, but should be welcomed as an essential part of the Church's mission to help the reader vote for candidates for public office in a manner consistent with moral teachings.


Again, from People Concerned for the Unborn Child, thank you to everyone who works to put the March for Life together. You could run a small country.


