PRO-LIFE PROGRESS IN HARRISBURG

After a drought of 18 years with no real pro-life progress, the PA House and Senate worked with several bills important to pro-life goals.

SB3 would prohibit abortion coverage in taxpayer-funded health insurance plans to be offered on state exchanges when/if Obamacare is imposed. It passed in the Senate on June 7. In late June it was approved by the House Insurance Committee. We expect to see it on the calendar after summer vacation. **PRO-LIFE ACTION: Thank PA Senators Kasunic, Orié, Pippy, Robbins, Solobay, Vogel, Ward, Don White and Mary Jo White who voted pro-life in committee and on the final vote. ALSO:** Senator Brewster voted for a crippling amendment, but he voted pro-life on the final vote. Senators Costa, Ferlo and Fontana voted for the crippling amendment, and they voted pro-abortion on the final vote. We supported Senators Costa and Fontana in the past, but we shall look for better candidates in the future.

PA House Bill 574 and Senate Bill 732 will hold abortion mills to the same health, fire, safety, personnel and equipment requirements and quality assurance procedures as other ambulatory surgical facilities. In late June the House Health Committee passed SB732 with essentially the same language as HB574. After summer recess, we expect the amended SB732 will go to the House floor for a vote and then be sent to the Senate for concurrence. **PRO-LIFE ACTION: Thank the pro-life legislators who stayed with us and voted pro-life on all these votes: Brooks, Christiana, Dom Costa, Daley, Deasy, DeLuca, Dunbar, Ellis, Evankovich, Gergely, Gibbons, Harhai, Hutchinson, Kreiger, Kortz Kotick, Kula, Longietti, Maher, Markosek, Marshall, Matzie, Metcalfe, Mustio, Oberlander, Petrarca, Pyle, Ravenstahl, Readshaw, Reed, Reese, Saccone, Sainato, Sam Smith, Stevenson, Turzai and Vulakovich. Rep. Tim Mahoney was absent.** E-mail, call or visit your state representative while he/she is at home this summer. Urge him/her to support and vote for SB3 and HB574/SB732.

"BRAIN DEATH" IS LIFE, NOT DEATH

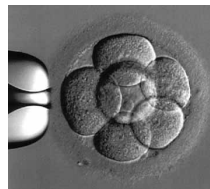


If a patient is able to process oxygen from the lungs to the bloodstream, maintain a normal body temperature, digest food and expel waste, grow to normal adult size from the age of four to twenty, and even carry a child to term, can he or she be considered dead? Can a person who is "dead" wake up and go on later to finish a university degree? Can a corpse get out of bed, go home and go fishing? Can he get married and have children?

These are real-life stories of patients declared "brain dead" presented by medical experts at "The Signs of Death" symposium held recently in Rome. Dr. Paul Byrne, a neonatologist and clinical professor of pediatrics at the University of Toledo, compared the struggle against "brain death" to the evil of slavery.

"Slavery was doing evil things to persons. This issue of 'brain death' was invented to get beating hearts for transplantation. And we cannot let this can go on. It must be stopped."

ADULT vs EMBRYONIC STEM CELLS



On the left is a photo of a three-celled embryo. Embryonic stem cells are ONLY found in human embryos at the very earliest stage of life (first few days). **Adult** stem cells can be found in almost any part of the human body, including skin, fat, bone marrow, baby teeth, and a newborn's cord blood or placenta.

A weekend "guest" on a KDKA-radio program is a local veterinarian who teaches his colleagues around the world about amazing cures using adult stem cells. When asked about embryonic stem cells, he rejects the possibility of their usefulness. 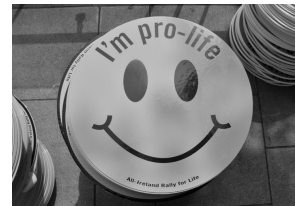

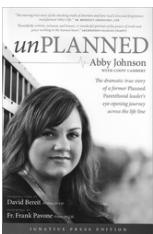

PA SB 750, The Revised Anatomical Gift Act provides for possible harm to an unconscious vulnerable person who enters a hospital by permitting administration of measures necessary to ensure the medical suitability of the donor's organs.

The Act (SB 750) fails to define "measures necessary to ensure the medical suitability" of the part, thus these measures would be anything an Organ Procurement Organization (OPO) wishes them to be, for example, measures that might be called treatment but in actuality might be harmful to the still living person. An example of this is instilling Betadine (Iodine) into the living person's stomach by way of feeding tube solely for the purpose of preserving organs. (Betadine is commonly used to wash hands and pre-op cleansing, but it is never otherwise used internally.)

The Bill is currently in the Senate Appropriations Committee. The best end for this "updated version of the body snatchers" will be that it never gets out of committee.

FIRST ARTIFICIAL TRACHEA

On July 8, the *Pittsburgh Tribune-Review* put a world-changing story on page B7. In Sweden, the world's first artificial trachea, made of stem cells, grown on a man-made plastic matrix, replaced a man's cancerous windpipe.

"This is the first permanent artificial organ ever," said Paolo Macchiarini, professor of regenerative surgery at the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm, who led an international team of researchers.

Just as remarkable as the manmade windpipe is how quickly it was produced. Collaborators in Sweden, London, and the United States created the trachea from scratch in just two days for a 36-year-old man whose cancer was so far advanced that only emergency surgery offered him any chance of survival.

Rejection is unlikely because the new trachea was made of a special plastic polymer and the patient's own cells. The patient, Andemariam Teklesenbet, said he was about to refuse the surgery but the doctor explained everything. "I prayed. I accepted it. I believed in it," he said.

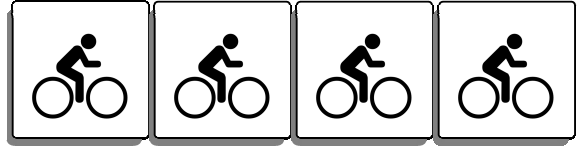
