ENDANGERED: OUR FUTURE IN PERIL



Dr. Brian Clowes exposes organizations around the world that push population control. After Paul Ehrlich was proven wrong with his hypothesis that, "in the 1970s the world will undergo famines—hundreds of millions of people will starve to death," other people and groups moved

in with scare tactics, money and popularity in the media. Warren Buffet, Bill and Melinda Gates, even Henry Kissinger stand out as leaders. Lesser known are their minions in the fields of education and "charities" like the Red Cross and the World Wildlife Fund.

Population control is promoted to the poor as the means to a better life. Then outfits like the United Nations Population Fund offer "prizes" like appliances, money and in one case, a donkey, to men who submit to vasectomies. They require that foreign nations accept population control programs if they want to receive financial aid from the U.S.

FEWER DOCTORS WILL DO ABORTIONS



A new study provides good news for pro-life advocates, as it shows fewer doctors are willing to perform abortions than before. The situation is that if abortion is less available, there will be fewer abortions.

The new report, published in the journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology, finds

97% of physicians surveyed say they have encountered patients wanting an abortion while only 14% of doctors are willing to do an abortion. That's lower than the 22% of doctors who said they would do an abortion in the last poll in 2008. Christian doctors were less likely to be abortionists.

ARE YOU AN ORGAN DONOR?



When he spoke at the PCUC Celebrate Life Banquet, Dr. Paul Byrne's address left no doubt about the conflict between love for our fellow man and the reality of federal organ donor programs.

We've known for a while that vital organs are of no use for transplantation from a dead body. What we did not know is

the deliberate deception that takes place when organs are wanted for transplant. Dr. Byrne offers a booklet with information that explains in fuller details the process of obtaining organs for transplant and the **federal regulations** that must be followed.

Did you know that a federal mandate issued in 1998 states that physicians, nurses, chaplains and other health care workers may not speak to a family of a potential organ donor without first obtaining approval from the regional organ retrieval system? The truth of the death of the organ donor, the gruesome facts of which are not learned until after the procedure has been completed, leaves family/loved ones isolated in guilt, pain and horror.

NON-INVASIVE DOWN SYNDROME TEST

A new non-invasive test for Down syndrome will soon be offered in 35 cities. According to an article in the journal **Genetics in Medicine**, it picks up 98.6% of Down syndrome children and has a false positive rate of only 0.2%.

Pro-lifers do not see this as a happy discovery. We know that our children with Down syndrome are already among the most endangered human beings on earth. We are not impressed that insured women will only be about \$235 out of pocket.

Sequenom, the manufacturer, has named the test MaterniT21, ironic in view of the fact that nearly all of the children detected with the test will be aborted. Of course media releases from the company tiptoed around that probability.

Down syndrome experts fear that non-invasive tests will eliminate Down syndrome children. Meanwhile, if you do the research, you find that other arms of science and medicine are very hopeful about new and helpful discoveries that will improve and enhance the lives of these precious children.

CITY REPEALS BAN ON LEAFLETTING

As was reported in the last *Newsletter*, the City of Pittsburgh's ordinance on leafleting was repealed. However, there have been some misconceptions perpetrated by the media about our case.

First, the media made it sound as if we were claiming that this was all about restricting pro-life speech. We NEVER made that claim. For myself, Al Brunn and our attorneys, we did not at any time, either in or out of court; claim that the ordinance was targeting pro-lifers or pro-life speech. What myself and Mr. Brunn happen to leaflet is pro-life literature and we had to present to the court what we leaflet as evidence. That's all. The ordinance did not in any way restrict leafleting because of the content of the message(s) contained within the leaflets and we never claimed that it did. We knew that the existence of the ordinance stemmed from issues of litter in an area of the city known as the South Side Flats.

Second, Mr. Brunn and I were not seeking damages/money from the city as part of the case. The settlement of \$35,000 was for the lawyer's fees and was paid directly to our attorneys by the City of Pittsburgh.

There were many restrictions on leafleting in this ordinance from leafleting cars to distribution of leaflets by hand and even restrictions on door-to-door leafleting.

Leafleting Cars Banned: **The ordinance stated** that anyone who wanted to leaflet cars was banned from doing so UNLESS he got **permission from the owner of every car** he wanted to leaflet. In relevance to the 14th Amendment, courts have ruled in many cases that an "undue burden" cannot be placed on a person's constitutional rights. How could anyone gain the permission of the owners of every single car in a parking lot or on a street to place a leaflet on his car? Within reason, he couldn't, hence an "undue burden" existed and that is unconstitutional. The **presumption of the law** is that every person would want to receive information unless he states otherwise. This is why "No Solicitation" signs exist. If this presumption didn't exist the 1st Amendment would have no meaning. [More about this case in a future issue. Editor]

TRUTH ON ABORTION & BREAST CANCER

The Coalition on Abortion/Breast Cancer says CBS News and Health.com have damaged their credibility by publishing identical statements that falsely claim the abortion-breast cancer (ABC) link is a myth.

"We expect CBS News and Health.com to duck the challenge...," said Karen Malec, president of the Coalition on Abortion/Breast Cancer. "After behaving like snipers, they cut and run. They should be ashamed of themselves."

The Breast Cancer Prevention Institute reported last week that 53 of 66 epidemiological studies reported an independent link between abortion and breast cancer, meaning that abortion leaves the breasts with more places for cancers to start (in addition to the loss of the protective link of childbearing),

National Cancer Institute branch chief Louise Brinton co-authored a 2009 study on the use of the birth control pill and triple-negative breast cancer. She and her colleagues included breast cancer among "known and suspected risk factors" for the disease and found a statistically significant 40% increased breast cancer risk among women who had abortions.
