ELECTION OF THE DECADE





Míss Nellíe Gray - 1924 - 2012



If we want to honor the memory of Nellie Gray and her life's work, then we must honor and support the Life Principles which are the embodiment of the goals and mission of the MARCH FOR LIFE, and therefore, the goals and mission of Nellie herself. Indeed, they ARE her legacy.

You will recall her mantra at every March for Life: SUPPORT THE LIFE PRINCIPLES/ NO EXCEPTIONS/NO COMPROMISE!

In the very front of the March there are young people, as many as fifty abreast, carrying the March for Life banner and the words SUPPORT THE LIFE PRINCIPLES with the logo of the Capital Building surrounded by the Red Rose, the symbol of the Pre-born Child, whose Right-to-Life we seek to restore through a mandatory Human Life Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

To the end of her days, Nellie exhorted us to embrace the Life Principle and the Equal Care Concept. Just days after Nellie Gray's death, Raymond Arroyo played a clip on **The World Over** from a previous interview with Nellie on EWTN. There she was in living color, exhorting us even in death, to support the Life Principles and the "Equal Care" concept, recognizing the "equal right to life" of both mother and child.

"Equal care" means that if the life of the mother and her child are mutually endangered, rather than write permission for abortion in the form of an exception clause for the life of the mother, we must stress the need to do what every good doctor always did before the 1973 Abortion Decision. The doctor must do all in his or her power to SAVE BOTH LIVES without making a value judgment on the worth of one life over the other. The medical profession must use all their expertise to save lives and to live up to their promise to DO NO HARM! In this way, we will restore the American medical profession to its high calling as healer and life saver, not life terminator.

While the concept of EQUAL CARE will always be associated with Nellie Gray and the March for Life, and rightly so, I would like to share with your readers a little history of that concept and its origins.

Actually, its origins were from right here in southwestern Pennsylvania. In those early days, Women Concerned for the Unborn Child (later to be known as PCUC), with Mary Winter at the helm, and the U.S. Coalition for Life, headed by Randy Engel, worked together. In many ways, it was a RIGHT-TO-LIFE THINK TANK where ideas were nurtured and shared. I was blessed to have both of these outstanding mentors educating me on some of the most important concepts coming out of the early pro-life movement.

When I, in turn, shared the "Equal Care" concept with Nellie, she readily embraced the idea as a moral and just solution to the problem of writing an "exception" clause in to the U.S. Constitution. Nellie understood that the Right to Life Movement could not and should not be responsible for writing permission for abortion into the U.S. Constitution where there is NO SUCH PERMISSION today. Think about it: would it not be the greatest tragedy of all, if history were to record that it was the Right-to-Life Movement that wrote permission for

abortion into the U.S. Constitution under the guise of exceptions? Remember, the Roe v Wade abortion decision of January 22, 1973 was based on an "implied right to privacy." The word "abortion" itself is found nowhere in the U.S. Constitution. As a lawyer, Nellie understood this, and that is why she could not abide the notion of "compromise."

Remember too that Nellie Gray was a veteran of World War II, and the dreadful lessons of the past would not be lost on her. She wrote, "The Great compromises of our times have not worked! Our Founding Fathers compromised the well-being of slaves and declared in our Constitution that each slave was three-fifths man and two-fifths property.

"Chamberlain went to Munich and gave the Czechoslovakian people to Hitler! Such compromises did not lessen the crisis, stop wars, nor save lives; rather, more lives were lost and the suffering of both victims and defenders was heightened and prolonged.

"Some fundamental values stand by themselves; the Right to Life is one. Perhaps 99% of political issues can be compromised; the Right to Life is not one of them."

Nellie readily embraced the "equal Care" concept as her own. When it came time to sit down and actually formulate the Life Principles before the 1976 March for Life, Nellie Gray and Bill Devlin came to Pittsburgh to further discuss the concept and put it into acceptable legal language.

It has always been deeply satisfying to know the "Equal Care" concept had its roots in our Greater Pittsburgh area. It was our particular contribution to the Life Principles and the goals of the MARCH FOR LIFE, and we hope, our contribution to the restoration of the RIGHT TO LIFE for all Americans, born and pre-born.

As Nellie wrote in the 1976 MARCH FOR LIFE Journal, "The Life Principles are set in the context of our Declaration of Independence which states that the right to life is inalienable and endowed by our Creator. If this basic right is weakened, all other rights are meaningless as the disparagement of the value and dignity of human beings permeates our society and the Laws of our land."

If we truly want to honor Nellie's life's work, we must honor and support the Life Principles as the embodiment of all she worked for over these past 40 years as she led the annual MARCH FOR LIFE.

Rest in peace, Nellie Gray! We pray that we can continue the "Good Fight" that first began some forty years ago around your dining room table when just a hand full of us, seven in all, said "Yes, we will March for Life, so that history would record THERE WAS A VOICE OF PROTEST RAISED IN OUR LAND AGAINST THE KILLING OF THE INNOCENT VICTIMS OF ABORTION.

Little did we know that from SUCH SMALL BEGINNINGS the MARCH FOR LIFE would inspire the millions who join their voices with ours, not only here in the United States, but throughout the world.

We have made this journey through the "moral desert" of our abortion culture for over FORTY YEARS with you at the head of our March. Thank you for your courage and for your faithful and principled leadership; may we follow your example and remain faithful to the very end of our Life's journey as you did before us!
