40 YEARS SINCE ROE V WADE

Can you believe it has been 40 years since seven of nine unelected, poorly informed, politically appointed Justices of the U.S. Supreme Court handed down death sentences to more than 50 million preborn children? Since January 22, 1974, people from cities, towns and villages across America gave of their time, energy, determination and prayers to bring upwards of FIVE MILLION MARCHERS to Washington, DC. GOVERNOR MADE WISE MOVE

This lends more credibility to the studies done on persons about quality of life. When well persons are described some debilitated state and asked if they would want to live under such circumstances, the answer is frequently "no."

When people with the very same disabilities are asked the question, the overwhelming response is "yes."

There is also evidence indicating that those given devastating diagnoses need time to adjust to those circumstances and perhaps be treated for the depression which frequently follows such a diagnosis. We should not act in haste under such circumstances either in our own situation or that of a loved one who seems to be suffering a tremendous psychological blow. It may only be temporary.

GOALS OF 1969 REACHED IN U.S. TODAY



Back in 1969 Frederick S. Jaffe, VP of Planned Parenthood-World Population sent a report to Bernard Berelson, president of the Population Council. U.N. DISABILITY RIGHTS TREATY



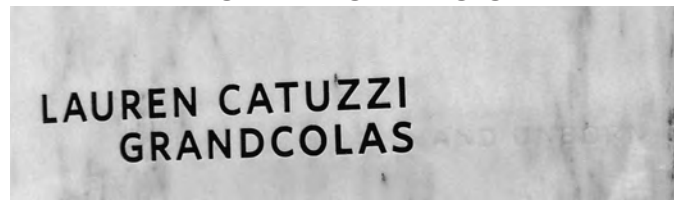

MEMORIAL FOR TWO ONE



We recently visited the Flight 93 Memorial in Shanksville, PA. The site has grown from the chain-link fence decorated with personal mementoes placed by visitors to show their respect and unity with the men and women who died here to a valley in the Alleghenies where people from all over the world can come to pay their respects and pray.

One of the large areas has a long line of vertical marble slabs, each with the name of one of the passengers who became a hero for their sacrifice. Beside the name of Lauren Catuzzi Grandcolas (above) are three startling words: AND UNBORN BABY. I asked the guide why the child is not better noted.
