She was advised to abort the baby because of her treatment. She said her baby was born fine and healthy. She said, "I just had to come by and thank you". We all hugged and kissed and cried. And she crossed the street to continue her life with her son, Michael.

Sally then had an observation. She said, "I don't think they were doing abortions today. But I do think we were sent here for a reason."

At this time Senomyx has agreements with four companies. Two, Ajinomoto and Firmenich, are not in the U.S. Nestles has products on the market using Senomyx, and they collaborate for future products. PepsiCo is using Senomyx for future products, but they are NOT using aborted fetal cell lines. Cadbury Adams ended their agreement in December 2011, and they have brought no product to market using Senomyx. **Right now the target is Nestles.**

ADULT STEM CELLS FOR AMPUTEES?



The ability for some species to regenerate limbs and other body parts is a fascinating part of nature. One flatworm, called the planarian, is so good at regeneration that it can be cut up in several pieces and each of those pieces will generate a whole new worm.

That regenerative power comes from stem cells that exist all over their bodies. Stem cells can become the cells that are needed for replacing all the missing body parts.

The dream has been that harnessing the power of stem cells, humans could also have this regenerative power to repair damaged or missing limbs. That dream is one step closer. Scientists have found that stem cells in the nail are key to regenerating missing toes in mice.

From *Discovery News*: Mammals can regenerate the very tips of their fingers and toes after amputation, and now new research shows how stem cells in the nail play a role in that process.

A study in mice, detailed online today (June 12) in the journal *Nature*, reveals the chemical signal that triggers stem cells to develop into new nail tissue, and also attracts nerves that promote nail and bone regeneration.

The findings suggest nail stem cells could be used to develop new treatments for amputees, the researchers said. In mice and people, regenerating an amputated finger or toe involves regrowing the nail. But whether the amputated portion of the digit can regrow depends on exactly where the amputation occurs: If the stem cells beneath the nail are amputated along with the digit, no regrowth occurs, but if the stem cells remain, regrowth is possible.

The researchers amputated the toes in two groups of mice. One group was given a drug to inhibit the signal for stem cells to grow new nail cells and the other was not. After five weeks the drug-free mice had regrown their missing digit. The mice that had been given the drug had not, indicating that the nail stem cells were critical for regeneration.

If scientists can find a similar mechanism in humans this could be the early beginnings of a treatment for amputees.

CHINA'S POLICIES NOT CHANGED

The *New York Times* ran a powerful op/end this week, written by a Chinese novelist, detailing the brutality of the country's one-child policy.

From the piece by Ma Jian:



Village family-planning officers vigilantly chart the menstrual cycle and pelvic-exam results of every woman of childbearing age in their area. If a woman gets pregnant without permission

and is unable to pay the often exorbitant fine for violating the policy, she risks being subjected to a forced abortion. According to Chinese Health Ministry data released in March, 336 million abortions and 222 million sterilizations have been carried out since 1971. (Though the one-child policy was introduced in 1979, other, less-stringent family planning policies were in place before it.)

These figures are easy to quote, but they fail to convey the magnitude of the horror faced by rural Chinese women. During a long journey through the hinterlands of southwest China in 2009, I was able to find some of the faces behind these numbers. On ramshackle barges moored on the remote waterways of Hubei and Guangxi, I met hundreds of “family-planning fugitives”—couples who’d fled their villages to give birth to an unauthorized second or third child in neighboring provinces. Almost every one of the pregnant women I spoke to had suffered a mandatory abortion. One woman told me how, when she was eight months pregnant with an illegal second child and was unable to pay the 20,000 yuan fine (about \$3,200), family planning officers dragged her to the local clinic, bound her to a surgical table and injected a lethal drug into her abdomen...

It is not surprising that China has the highest rate of female suicide in the world. The one-child policy has reduced women to numbers, objects, a means of production; it has denied them control of their bodies and the basic human right to determine freely and responsibly the number and spacing of their children. Baby girls are also victims of the policy. Under family pressure to ensure that their only child is a son, women often choose to abort baby girls or discard them at birth, practices that have skewed China's sex ratio to 118 boys for every 100 girls.

This should make China a pariah. But there's money to be made and cheap labor aplenty.

A portrait of Jesus has special meaning for Nikki Bruni. If you look closely at "Divine Mercy Jesus," you see 2,470 squares cut out of linoleum. Each square represents a baby aborted at Planned Parenthood on Liberty Avenue in downtown Pittsburgh in 2012. There are also 14 gold stars around the head of Jesus. They represent babies saved by pro-life counselors who carry on a vigil outside PP.

A book is placed near the portrait for those who wish to name the unnamed babies represented by the 2,470 squares.

Nikki, who has a fine arts degree from Carnegie Mellon University, is co-leader of 40 Days for Life, held each spring and fall by pro-life people who choose blocks of time during the 40 days to pray for an end to abortion.

FEWER RACES FOR KOMEN

Since the public relations debacle erupted in 2012 regarding funding eligibility criteria for Planned Parenthood, Komen has seen a slew of executives at headquarters leave the organization. Students for Life: Answering the Call, Making the Case, Saving Lives

How many times have you come away from a discussion with an abortion proponent and wished that you had been just a bit more convincing? Before you find yourself in another such bind you should read John Ensor's and Scott Klusendorff's *Students for Life: Answering the Call, Making the Case, Saving Lives*. In only 144 engaging pages this handy paperback will equip you with advice and information that even experienced pro-lifers will find helpful.

The authors spend the first several chapters advising the reader on how to fruitfully engage others on the topic of abortion. They discuss simple techniques such as staying on topic, staying patient, never demeaning your opponent and asking good questions to give yourself control of the conversation. They provide a roadmap to dealing with the moral relativism that pro-abortionists often use to make their case.

Part of fruitfully engaging involves being fully informed. Did thousands of women die each year from illegal abortions before *Roe v Wade*? (No – The DCD reports 39 deaths from abortion in 1972). What about those hard topics such as rape and life of the mother? Ensor and Klusendorf deal with these and others in a sympathetic but rational and logical fashion. They provide lucid answers to questions such as "If men can't get pregnant, should they speak up on abortion?" They quote experts in the field and provide an extensive bibliography of notes and sources.

After announcing last year that we were too old to do Face the Truth tours anymore, this year instead of doing five days we set up a seven day twenty two site tour. We are not only old but losing it mentally as well. On Sunday, June 9 we started with the regular every other month 2 hours at Magee Hospital where Magee reported to the PA Department of Health that they destroyed 232 preborn babies, mostly late term (4 to 6-1/2 months old) in 2011.

Monday through Friday sites were without serious incidents. The weather was rainier than normal but not too bad. The police were great. We notify them in advance so they are not surprised when people call complaining about the graphic nature of our posters. At most sites we would see a police car drive by but only one of them stopped to talk to us. That was in Robinson Twp where an officer said they had a complaint that someone was walking in traffic. He advised us against that and said "people fly by here at high speed and we are concerned about your safety".



At the Liberty Tunnels a worker gave Bob some concern as he approached but he put his hand to shake. He then proceeded to tell the story of his girlfriend having had an abortion years previously. He said he prayed for forgiveness every day. He then went on to say, "if you people save **one** baby's life by doing this it will be worth it. God bless you. Now I got to get back to work".

In Pleasant Hills a guy came out of his office and said Bob was standing on his property and had to move. Bob said, "Lots of people are walking by here and there is a 5 to 10 foot easement along the road where we can stand." The guy said, "Move or I'll call the police". Bob continued to stand there and the guy said, well are you going to move? Bob said, "I don't know what to do." and the guy said, "Then I'm going to call the police." A bit later a police car drove by and looked, but did not stop.

On Thursday we had picked a new site on the Northside. There was little traffic there so we moved up Cedar Avenue to East North Ave in front of Allegheny General Hospital. Within minutes there were security guards all over us. Fr. Van went over to talk to them. They told him that the sidewalk was **their** property and we had to move. Fr. Van tried to reason with them but to no avail. The Chief of Security came out and said he was going to call the police if

we didn't move off "**his**" sidewalk. There must have been four or five police cars that came. It was like a major crime scene. The cops talked to the security people and left and the guards went back in the hospital. I am sure the police explained to them that the sidewalk was not "their property". You'd think that they would know that.

On Friday at the last stop on Rt. 19 & Connor Rd. in Mt Lebanon a most interesting confrontation took place. Fr. Van was sitting in his car in the parking lot reading his breviary. He was far from all the signs except Bob's who was on 19 staying close to the van. Bob noticed a car pulled up next to Fr. Van. Bob dropped his sign and went over to observe. A lady got out of her car and was talking to Fr. Van. I looked at her license plate and it was illegible, covered with a yellowed plastic. Strange! She was telling Fr. Van that he was being judgmental and that he was a hypocrite. She then said, "I hope you burn in hell forever" And then she left. Now I am not being spooky or anything but I honestly believe that that was no lady. That was the devil himself. Otherwise, why would she/he seek out Fr. Van who was completely removed from the intersection where all the people and where all the signs were. This was satanic! Thank you, Fr. Van, for joining us and protecting us.



This year's tour was a great success. There were as many as 15 to 20 people at several sites. Thank you all. More than a dozen people we know told us they saw us on the street. Tens of thousands more saw what brutally painful abortion does to that innocent preborn child. Not everyone liked what they saw but it was the truth and the truth can hurt.

Thank you to Mary Catherine, Maureen and Joan for serving delicious meals to the troops. And thank you to one of Maureen's kids who, when he heard we were coming to his house for lunch said, "Are those the people from the Face the **Food** Tour?" That was us alright. And finally, thank you to the Passionate Nuns (Mary Beth's words) for their prayers.
