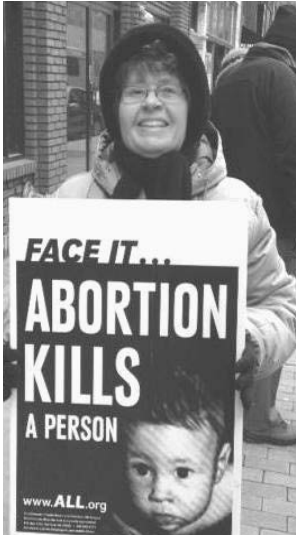

P-G ARTICLE DEMANDS RESPONSE

To the Editor:

As a pro-lifer, I was very encouraged to read the article, "I am an abortion provider," [p. D-1, Sunday, February 28, 2016.] As usual, any article on the abortion issue is so slanted that it almost slides off the page (see P-G coverage of the annual March for Life). But it was heartening to see that the only arguments for abortion given by Shelia Ramgopal, the abortionist, were old retreads of a story that didn't work then and doesn't work now. And the illustration was pro-life; yes a woman has the ability to produce new life growing inside her and that's a beautiful thing.

First, Ms Ramgopal states that as an obstetrician and gynecologist, she delivers "babies," not embryos or fetuses. What kind of mental gymnastics separates the human babies (genus and species *Homo sapiens*) that she delivers from the human fetuses (genus and species *Homo sapiens*) that she kills in abortions? What is the bottom line for ending the life of a live human being (fetuses are alive or else they won't have to be killed in an abortion), is it: chosen or unchosen, age, size, ability or disability, wanted or unwanted, rich or poor, white or black? Who decides who gets the right to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness"? If the decision is based solely on "choice" that choice better be 100% accurate because a human being's life is at stake, that of the babies that Ramgopal either delivers or dismembers.

Moreover, Ramgopal justifies her abortions stating: "Abortion has been practiced for centuries in many forms. . ." So has slavery, so has prejudice, so has discrimination, so has genocide; it's always been someone's choice to dehumanize another human being. It's always been somewhat easy to make peace with evil. Do we kill human beings to solve our problems? Do we legitimize evil or fight against it?

The rest of the article was awash with old errors, myths and downright lies. Some documentation would have been most helpful in swallowing such misinformation. But it's understandable that the abortion lobby is in trouble in this department. With the access to internet interviews with abortion providers letting it be known that there's money to be made in fetal tissue sales and with Dr. Anthony Levantino, a former abortionist

(he knows of what he speaks, he performed 1200 abortions), giving an "inside" look at what actually happens during an abortion. (AbortionProcedures.com)

It must be chilling to an abortionist to know that eventually the truth does give light to what this "choice" actually does to a woman and anyone involved. And now with sonograms showing the human being growing inside the womb, even in commercials, that's a hard picture/video to deny.

With so much help available to women with pregnancy needs, found in a phone call to 1.800.712.HELP, anywhere, at any time, for any need, finally, abortion is being seen not a "choice" but the tragedy it has always been.

PP BLINDSIDED BY ITSELF

Selling the pieces of babies they abort and making a profit from that side business has not made PP more popular. The last quarter of PP's fiscal year began in July, the same month they were ambushed by the first video from the Center for Medical Progress. In that quarter alone, PP spent \$600,000 for public relations and marketing in an attempt to put the video genie back in the bottle.

The PP Action fund, lamenting they could not afford to lose more than half a billion dollars in federal (that's you and me) funding was able to find \$20 million to donate to Hilary Clinton's campaign and various Senate campaigns. The backlash to the endorsement has been swift and harsh.

About ten days after the first video surfaced, Coca Cola, Ford and Xerox requested their names be removed from the PP website. Three US House Committees, a Select Investigative Panel and the Judiciary Committee are investigating.

PA ABORTION STATS ARRIVE



In 2014 there were 32,126 abortions reported in PA. The number represents an increase of 18 or 0.1 % from 2013. Allegheny County was second only to Philadelphia in number of abortions: 6202

Almost 49% (15,691) of abortions were to white women, and 13,782 or 42.9% were to black or African-American women. Patients age 19 and under accounted for 10.7% or 3,442 abortions, but the largest single age group was 20-24 for 10,848 or 33.8% of abortions.
