

PP WILL RUE FIRING OF HANDEL

Planned Parenthood invested more than half a million dollars trying to keep Karen Handel from becoming the first Republican female to represent Georgia in the U.S. House of Representatives. They failed. May it be the first of many such failures.

Handel, who has made a career of women's health and anti-breast cancer advocacy, was senior VP for public policy at the Susan B. Komen Foundation for the Cure. The breast cancer charity tasked Handel with figuring out how to cut ties with PP in part because its grants to the abortion company were not effective.

In 2011 Planned Parenthood was under investigation by the U.S. House. **PP doesn't do mammograms. It does less than two percent of all women's cancer screenings in the U.S.**

At that time, PP unleashed a media and political campaign against Handel and forced Komen to reverse its decision. Handel resigned and declined a severance package.

She then wrote PLANNED BULLYHOOD: The Truth Behind the Headlines about the PP Funding Battle with Susan G. Komen for the Cure.

DON'T GIVE AWAY THIS RIGHT!



We urge you to contact your state legislators and tell them to oppose HB111—so-called "merit selection of judges" legislation. In this bill, voters

would lose their right to vote for judges in PA's Commonwealth, Superior and Supreme Courts. Election of judges by voters would be replaced by selection by an appointed panel followed by Senate confirmation. This move would require amending the PA Constitution via a referendum starting with passage of House Bill 111. If you are not sure who your PA Senator or Representative is, call PCUC, and we will help you find him/her.

RESTORE PENNSYLVANIA'S LEADERSHIP

The Keystone State used to be our nation's leader in the passage of pro-life legislation. The number of abortions in PA in 1980 was 65,777. In 2015, the number was 31,818.

PA still gives approximately \$6 million of OUR tax dollars annually to Planned Parenthood, allowing 1588 dismemberment abortions and 380 post 20-week gestation abortions to be committed each year.

Recently the PA Department of Health closed an abortion mill in Harrisburg after state inspectors found many violations. Two weeks prior to that decision, pro-lifers won a lawsuit against a Harrisburg ordinance which created buffer zones that silenced pro-life speech on public sidewalks around abortion mills.

Congratulations and thank you to Becky Biter and Colleen Riley who brought the suit and "hats off" to Liberty Counsel, who represented you.

PRO-LIFERS STOP PP @ READING, PA H.S.

Massive outcry from pro-life students and local activists caused a PP school board to pull a proposal for establishment of a Planned Parenthood-run "sexual health counseling center" in a high school.

But it isn't over. The board may try again.

AccessMatters, a pro-abortion group, wants a "center" inside Reading High School. They are likely to keep trying. Students for Life is helping citizens resist these "services." To let PP into a school is to invite a culture of abortion, contraception and their accompanying problems.

Last year, Pittsburgh citizens went to the school board to resist a PP presence in the junior high schools. The effort paid off, but vigilance prevails.
