NOTHING TO BE PROUD ABOUT

How sad it was to see THE NEW YORK TIMES on December 7, 2018, telling us that the Parliament in Dublin, by a vote of 90 to 15 with 12 abstentions, passed a bill that will allow a woman to seek an abortion for any reason up to the 12th week of pregnancy, and later in a case of fatal fetal abnormality or serious risk to a woman's life or health. Also, a mandatory three-day waiting period after first consulting a doctor.

Last May, 66 percent of voters approved a referendum to remove a near-total ban on abortion from Ireland's constitution. Some groups objected to the three-day waiting period.

UPDATE ON MAGEE PROJECT



The Magee Project had a wonderful breakthrough in November. We were able to address the Board of Magee-Womens Hospital.

Seventeen representatives of The Magee Project were warmly welcomed by Board Chair William Pietragallo, Il, Esq, to an almost full house of Board members. GENE EDITING: HUMAN TRAIN WRECK

The revelation in November that He Jainkui, a Chinese researcher, edited genes in human embryos and then implanted them in a woman was "a train wreck of a thing to do," said an ethicist at the National Catholic Bioethics Center (NCBC) in Philadelphia.

"Normally clinical research proceeds in phases. First, verify it works in animals, etc. Second, verify that it's safe. In small things you verify that it's effective," said John Brehany, CBC's director of institutional relations.

Even Chinese officials say He violated their standards. He said he practiced on human embryos, so that means he probably destroyed them in the context of experimentation.

"There's a lot of gene editing that goes on in agriculture and in animals and there have been some experiments that have gone on in humans since the 1990s.

"If you introduce changes into a woman's eggs, or a man's sperm, or a human embryo within a very short period after conception, those genes not only introduce genes into cells but into future generations, and that is an opportunity in some respects, but it's also controversial." Brehany said.

Gene editing is illegal in the U.S., and China said what He did was illegal in China.

The Catholic Church's position is spelled out in the 2008 Vatican document "Instruction 'Dignitas Personae' ('The Dignity of a Person'): On Certain Bioethical Questions." The dignity of a person, the document says, "must be recognized in every human being from conception to natural death. This fundamental principle expresses a great 'yes' to human life and must be at the center of ethical reflection on biomedical research." Source: OSV

FAKE CLINICS – FAKE FEMINISM



Maria McFadden Maffucci, editor of THE HUMAN LIFE REVIEW, wrote an article for the Spring 2018 edition where she reveals the movement to attempt to destroy the

life-saving support given by Pregnancy Support Centers. Motivation for the attacks is clear: There are 4,000 pregnancy centers compared to 780 abortion providers. Services at the pregnancy centers are free while abortion mills worry about the bottom line.

KASICH VETOES HEARTBEAT BILL



Ohio Gov. John Kasich vetoed a bill that would prohibit abortions after an unborn baby's heartbeat is detectable. He also vetoed similar legislation in 2016. He rejected the bills based on the unlikelihood of it

succeeding in a court challenge.

Kasich explained that he believes the bill would be struck down as unconstitutional before it could save any lives. He also said the legal challenge would cost Ohio taxpayers money.

"...I have worked hard to strengthen Ohio's protections for the sanctity of human life, and I have a deep respect for my fellow members of the pro-life community and their ongoing efforts in defense of unborn life. However, the central provision of Sub. H.B. 258, that an abortion cannot be performed if a heartbeat has been detected in the unborn child, is contrary to the Supreme Court's current rulings on abortion. As the losing party, the state of Ohio will have to pay hundreds of thousands of taxpayer dollars to the pro-choice activists' lawyers,"

The bill passed the state legislature earlier this month. HB258 would ban most abortions in Ohio by prohibiting abortions after an unborn baby's heartbeat is detectable. Research suggests a baby's heartbeat may begin as early as 18 days after conception, but is typically heard around six weeks. The bill also would allow abortionists to be charged with a felony for violations.

Kasich did sign a second pro-life bill Friday that prohibits dismemberment abortions. In these second-trimester abortion <u>procedures</u>, nearly fully formed unborn babies are torn limb from limb while their hearts are beating.

Heartbeat bills have been met with skepticism in the past, even by some pro-life groups. North Dakota and Arkansas passed heartbeat bills several years ago, but federal courts struck down both laws.

SC BILL COULD SLAY ROE V. WADE
