Just as we began our vigil on February 13<sup>th</sup> with Jesus present with us...so we ended in the same way on March 24. There were 27 church groups that adopted time slots and hundreds of individuals that took part in the daily prayers on the sidewalk! *We believe that at least 8 babies were spared from abortion* that we know of, and

- The truth is that abortion is the killing of a human child. The child not yet born, is absolutely a son or daughter created in the image and likeness of God.
- Scientific research has provided ample evidence that the unborn child is a separate person from the moment of conception.
- Abortion degrades women, treating their fertility as a defect or a disease. Abortion enables men to objectify, use and then leave women with no support or true love when they need it the most.
- All people have the right to live, not just those who are already born. Just because a person is tiny and hidden, that person must not be denied this most fundamental right to live.
- Abortion strikes also at the heart of the nuclear family, betraying the fruit of marital love, a child that gives hope and life for the future.
- We may cry out God, "Why do you not send, O Lord, someone to find the answer to cure, cancer or to prevent the next pandemic? Why do you not send someone who can solve the problem of violence in the Middle East or in Ukraine?" The answer from heaven may be, "I did, but you aborted them."
- I believe that just as Jesus Christ laid down His life for all of us, I am called as a Catholic, as a priest and as a bishop, to lay down my life for my unborn brothers and sisters and for their mothers. I will never stop advocating for them until God calls me at the end of my earthly life. For in the end, it is love that is victorious, not violence and killing of the most vulnerable.

### **JOY IN THE MIDST OF GARBAGE!**

I just want to share a story about a funny thing that happened to me on Sunday, as I was leaving to attend our 40 Days for Life closing events. It was one of those things that wasn't funny at the time, if you know what I mean.

I jumped in my car at 3pm, in order to get to the Jericho March around PP by 3:30. I pushed the start button on my car...and nothing happened. "Oh no! What is wrong?"

I checked inside my purse where I always keep my car key. Nothing there! What could have happened? I ALWAYS keep my car key in my purse! Where in the world could it be? I don't have a spare key!!! My mind starts racing about what to do. How do I get downtown in time, and how will I drive my car for the rest of the week? What will it cost to get another key and how long will it take?

I run back into the house and immediately begin to **search inside all of my coat pockets.** I race upstairs and get on my hands and knees, searching under the bed and under desks and in corners...in the laundry room...everywhere I could think of. Now it is too late to make the Jericho March, but I have to be there for the Eucharistic Procession! I tell my husband he needs to drop what he is doing and drive me in his truck. As we head down our street in his truck, he remembers he left his phone at home, so we turn around and head back. As we are headed back home, I have an idea. I wonder if I could have accidentally thrown my keys in the trash? I had emptied the kitchen trash and put the bag outside earlier that day. The thought of sorting through all the gross-ness was not appealing to me, especially since I really didn't think there was much chance of

my keys being in there...but then another idea came to me: "Just grab the whole garbage bag and put it in the car!" I sat in the driver's seat and pushed the button. It started! Joy!!! My husband and I were suddenly all smiles, as we sorted through the gross coffee grounds, bits of slimy vegetables and other disgusting things. We were able to have joy while doing this because we knew that the keys were definitely in there!

After washing my hands, and washing off my keys, I finally got in my car and headed to Pittsburgh in time for the closing. As I was driving, still with a smile on my face (and thanking St. Anthony!)...I had a funny realization come to me. If I hadn't already known that my keys were in that trash bag, I would have not had any joy while sorting through the contents. Quite the opposite. I can imagine that I would have felt a sort of desperate hopelessness...a last-ditch effort that I would have been doing in desperation. But because I KNEW WITHOUT A DOUBT that my keys were there, it didn't matter how nasty the job was, or even how long it would take to find them. I was assured of victory!

And it occurred to me as I was driving, that that same principal applies to the dirty, nasty, seemingly hopeless work that we do on the sidewalk. People who see us there must think we are crazy to think that our prayerful presence will make a difference...as couple after couple walk right by us to go in and have their children killed. But we know better. We KNOW WITHOUT A DOUBT that Christ has already won the victory for us! It doesn't matter how dark and hopeless it seems in the moment, and it sure does look dark and hopeless right now, doesn't it???

Tomorrow is Maundy Thursday, where our Lord is betrayed and captured. Friday He will be tortured mercilessly and crucified. He will suffer and die for us. However, in just a few short days, He will rise victorious! And for those of us who love Him...we will get to share in that victory! So don't ever give up hope!

We march on to victory in Christ!
