NEWS FROM THE SIDEWALK

"The Best Way to Close an Abortion Clinic"



Recently, while discussing sidewalk counseling strategies with my brother, a thought experiment was posed: what would one of the great saints do if they were to minister at an abortion clinic?

Very quickly we both came up with the same answer: *He or she would probably pray, and the clinic would close.*

Of course the supplications of even a saint are not guaranteed to be granted. The extent to which God will suffer the continuation of a particular evil is hidden from us. But I was struck by the fact that we both intuitively thought that for a very holy person, prayer would be the central and decisive response, rather than any sort of innovative or ingenious approach.

I mean in no way to discount the many pro-life activities undertaken, not the least of which is actively counseling on the sidewalk. The saints themselves often were people of great action, undertaking huge projects of evangelization and ministry for those in all walks of life.

But what I learned from thinking of the saints was that, whatever else they did, prayer was their uniquely central activity, effecting great (even if unseen) change and guiding their external actions.

The centrality of prayer is a simple fact, but one I need to more seriously put into action. If you don't already, please take a few moments of every day to place yourself in the presence of Almighty God and personally beseech Him to end abortion. A woman may decide not to listen to us on the sidewalk. But God always listens to the prayers of his faithful people.

EAST LIBERTY ABORTION CLINIC FAILS INSPECTION



Allegheny Reproductive is an abortion clinic in the East Liberty section of Pittsburgh that kills approximately 4,000 pre-born babies every year.

On April 15 of this year, the PA Department of Health reported that the facility was in violation PA health regulations because it had administered anesthesia to minor patients without the proper medical personnel. According to PA law, only a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) or Medical Doctor may give a anesthesia to a minor. It was discovered that this facility had given anesthesia to two minor patients using RN's only. In response to this report, Allegheny Reproductive's "Plan of Correction" is that they will cease providing the anesthesia "Ketamine" to their minor patients.

PA WANTS TO ELIMI-NATE SAFETY MEASURES FROM ABORTION CLINICS

A recent memo by 12 PA Representatives directed to the House

Health Committee entitled, "Removing Unnecessary Admitting Barriers for Abortion Providers" is urging the removal of the current safety measure which requires abortion clinics to have admitting privileges with a hospital no less than 30 minutes away. The memo says:

In Pennsylvania, an abortion facility must have a transfer agreement with a hospital no further than a 30 -minute drive. Major public health --and medical groups, including The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, believe that these regulations are unnecessary as there is no evidence to support that providers that perform abortions need hospital privileges to ensure a safe outcome for the patient.

For these reasons, we plan to introduce legislation to remove the excessive mandate that abortion providers maintain admitting privileges or have transfer agreements with hospitals, which only causes another obstacle in obtaining access to care. By removing the unnecessary limitations that healthcare providers experience when delivering essential health care, abortion can be more accessible and obtainable to all Pennsylvanians.

Please join us in co-sponsoring this important legislation that would increase access to safe abortion ser-

They never stop. This could very well get votes. Upon reading the contents of the bill, I am extremely concerned that this bill will put women at high risk in the case of medical complications during an abortion.

HB2517 seeks to create a licensure carve out in The Health Care Facilities Act by adding: "An

abortion facility shall not be required to have a transfer agreement with a hospital".

Effectively, they seek to treat abortion facilities differently from all other ambulatory surgical facilities in Pennsylvania, particularly in regards to the safety of the patient in the case of medical complications during an abortion.

It seeks to nullify the statutory requirements of 28 Pa. Code § 29.33(10), specifically voiding the requirement for an abortion facility to have a transfer agreement with an emergency care-capable hospital within a 30 minute drive in the case of a woman's medical emergency.

Since this was referred to the House Health Committee, please ask them not to advance this bill.
