FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Dear Friends of Life,

I had the pleasure of attending a Pro-Life Advocates meeting this past Saturday, hosted by His Excellency, Bishop William Waltersheid at St. John Neumann Church. The good Bishop had much to say about the evils of abortion, especially how it is a direct attack on human life; specifically against society and the family.

Not surprisingly, the topic on everyone's mind these days came up – the upcoming election. Bishop Waltersheid, without naming names, spoke the well-known truth, that one candidate supports abortion, and the other, while not perfect, comes closest to our views on the sanctity of life and the evil of abortion. I asked him directly, what he would say to those pro-life advocates, who are having difficulty voting for someone who does not align perfectly with all their pro-life beliefs. He replied, that "it is ok to vote for someone who, while they are not a perfect pro-life candidate, gives us the best chance to defeat someone who would make abortion legal up until birth, and would shut down all our pro-life efforts and freedom to fight this evil.

Peter Elliott, one of our PCUC board members, stood up and directly quoted the directive from the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, who stated in a near unanimous vote that it is the moral responsibility of all Catholics (and I'll add Christians) to properly prepare for and vote in the November 5th election. He quoted directly from a pamphlet he had prepared using the USCCB guide, Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship.

Clause 64 from the USCCB – "Abortion and euthanasia have become preeminent threats to human life and dignity because they directly attach life itself, the most fun-

damental good and the condition for all others. Abor tion, the deliberate killing of a human being before birth, is never morally acceptable, and must always be opposed.

And Clause 65. "Laws that legitimize any of these practices are profoundly unjust and immoral. Our Conference supports laws and policies to protect human life to the maximum degree possible, including constitutional protection for the unborn and legislative efforts to end abortion, assisted suicide, and euthanasia."

In summary, the Catholic bishops came out strongly against abortion and state that we must oppose it with all that we have, including our votes and our voices for the candidate that gives us the best chance to limit and perhaps end abortion. I acknowledge that this individual is by no means perfect, but spending your vote on another 3rd party candidate to send a message or signal a protest, is akin to the old saying, 'If a tree falls in the woods, and no one is around to hear it, does it make a sound?"

If you want to be heard, I think there is an obvious choice. Please don't throw your vote away in a futile protest. It's the same numerically as half a vote for the abortion candidate.

Like many of you who are active in pro-life work, *I have been living* with a sense of dread for the past few weeks...knowing how insanely busy the fall months are.

Looking ahead and seeing the March for Life in Harrisburg on Monday, our 40 Days for Life Kick-off on Tuesday, the 40-day vigil beginning on Wednesday, along with my own parish respect life events...and our PCUC fall luncheon coming up in October (for which I am in charge)...has been causing my anxiety levels to rise. I didn't sleep much the night before last, and was feeling like I was coming down with a cold yesterday. That added to my fears, that now I was going to have to push through this crazy time while not feeling well.

Thank God that I have been able to persevere in an early morning hour of Eucharistic Adoration at the Oratory four days a week, and Mass every morning. Even yesterday, when I was tired and not feeling well, I forced myself to get up and go, and I am so glad I did. Being in front of Jesus...in the same room with Him...made me feel instantly better. A calming peace and reassurance filled my soul as I realized that it is a good thing to pour oneself out for the Lord.

This morning, while in front of Him, I had an image of what it is like in the spiritual realm, when we try to "save" some of ourselves, for ourselves. It would be like trying to save some delicious, but perishable food. Because we didn't want it to be gone, instead of eating it, we decided to keep it indefinitely. By doing that, it would be wasted. It would simply rot, become rancid and full of maggots. Whereby, if we had eaten it...it would become part of us...strengthening us and giving us life.

That is what it means to give ourselves over to God completely. If we think we need to save a part of our life for ourselves...it will simply rot and be wasted. But if we pour ourselves out completely, without fear or reserve, God will take every drop that we give Him, and He will make something beautiful...something eternal. Nothing is wasted if we give it to God.

So...this is what I am telling myself, as we begin our 40 day prayer vigil on the sidewalk in front of PP. He will use every drop of our energy...our fatigue and our suffering. He will use it to convert souls and to save precious lives.

I shared the remarkable abortion numbers for 2023. In the past, more than half of the abortions at Magee have been in the second trimester. In 22, only 34% were in the second trimester and in 2023, that number dropped to 29%!

PITTSBURGH'S 40 DAYS FOR LIFE KICK OFF DREW HUNDREDS!



I love it when God reminds us that HE is the ONE in charge of 40 Days for Life. It is not me, thank goodness! First of all, the weather yesterday was not looking good. It was pouring rain for much of the afternoon, and the forecast for the evening was more of the same. Well...it turns out that His Will was for us to have an absolutely gorgeous evening for our kick -off Mass and Eucharistic Procession to Planned Parenthood! The air was warm and balmy, with a gentle breeze...the sky was luminous and beautiful. Despite there being a Pens game going on right next door, hundreds of faithful men, women and children were able to get to the event on time...including 12 priests and 2 deacons! And best of all...no protestors! We had a wonderful peace as we walked, following our Lord, surrounded by our fathers, brothers and sisters in the faith.



Speaking of there being 12 priests...do you think that is a coincidence? There were a few priests that I thought were coming that didn't show up...and there were a few priests that I didn't know were coming that came. It seems that God always brings 12 of His sons to the altar for our kick-off Mass. And the reading today, which I quoted above, says that Jesus summoned the twelve and gave them power and authority over all demons. That is so important for us to remember!

When we begin our 40 day prayer vigil at Planned Parenthood, we begin it with the power and authority of Jesus Christ Himself! Fr. Christopher Donley, as an installed pastor of Divine Mercy Parish, has...by the bishop of the Diocese of Pittsburgh's authority, the authority over all demons inside the geographical area of his parish...including

933 Liberty Avenue. The devil is very legalistic. He knows the hierarchal authority of the Church. He knows that when Jesus shows up, he has to flee. And so, as long as we continue to have these Eucharistic Processions to Planned Parenthood, he knows that his days are numbered. We have to believe that.



Although the Church was very much filled, and we were happy with the attendance...one person made a comment to me that he wished as many people would take part in our Mass as were filing into PPG Arena for the Pens game. I thought about that and actually disagreed. I told him that if thousands of people were cramming into Mass for our kick-off...and only hundreds were going into the arena...I would be worried. Jesus said that the way to destruction is broad and wide, and many go there. But the way that leads to life is narrow and hard and few find it. I told him that God always calls a small remnant. That is His way. So I think we should be encouraged that our numbers are small... compared with the world. It is a sign that we are on the right road.


