

FROM OUR DIRECTOR

Going to Extremes...

If you were about to lose someone who was the most important person in your life...to what extremes would

you be willing to go in order to keep them?

Most of the time, in ordinary life, we live in relative moderation. We sleep, we wake, we have our coffee, go to work, spend time with family...you know...the regular routine. It's not often that we do something that the world would consider "extreme".

But what if our "regular routine" consisted of all the things mentioned above, with one other addition...driving to an abortion center and praying for an hour? Would you call that "extreme? I don't think it is...but the world certainly must, because hardly anyone does it! Even among the most faithful Christians, very few have ever prayed in front of In our Pittsburgh Diocese, an abortion clinic. (according to Wikipedia), there are over 625,000 Catholics. In order to take into consideration that many of those people may be too old or too young, or too busy with family and work commitments to make witnessing for the unborn child a priority...do you think we could safely say that ten percent of Catholics in Pittsburgh should be able to fit an hour of prayer on the sidewalk into their weekly schedule? Would that seem fair? If that's the case, we should have about 6,250 weekly volunteers in front of Planned Parenthood or Allegheny Reproductive. We have 50.

I began this reflection by asking a question. To what extremes would you go to in order to hold on to someone that you love? This question came to me yesterday, as I was reading the Gospel from John 21. It was the story of Peter jumping out of his fishing boat into the sea, in order to get to the Risen Jesus. Peter loved Jesus so much that he just couldn't wait until they rowed the boat to shore, even though it was only 50 yards away! As I read this verse yesterday, I pondered the sort of passion that would lead someone to such an extreme show of love as demonstrated by Saint Peter. It occurred

to me that there are two things that probably played into the desperation for Jesus that Peter had: First of all, Peter knew how special Jesus was. He had witnessed Jesus' miracles first hand! *And secondly...Peter knew what it was like to lose Jesus.* He saw Him in the grave. To have something that you love, and then to lose it...that will make you desperate.

That made me think back to March 30, 2013... when I first received Jesus in Holy Communion. Although I had already come to know and love Him through reading Sacred Scripture, it was the first time that I actually met Him in the Flesh. The experience was especially precious to me because I realized that I came very close to never meeting Him in that most intimate way. I became desperate for Him because I knew how special He was, and because I almost lost Him.

We pray at abortion clinics because we recognize how precious every human life is, and our witness shows the world that life is worth defending. Those poor mothers and fathers who walk past us to enter those terrible doors do not know the value of the life they are destroying, and they don't realize the grief that they will endure because of their loss.

Peter would probably not have followed Jesus if others weren't already crowding around Him to hear His preaching. He would not have left his old life behind if he hadn't witnessed the miracle of the catch of fish. Similarly, if there are no Christians praying in front of abortion clinics, how are these poor, uninformed parents supposed to realize the value of the life they are carrying?

If no one cares enough to come out to pray and witness for the sanctity of human life, then human life must not be all that important after all.

Unfortunately PP seems to be open on most Mondays, so I am happy to see that Monday is starting to attract a couple of regular shifts. We need to make sure that the sidewalk in front of PP is not empty on Mondays! ABBY JOHNSON JOINS PITTSBURGH 40 Days for Life Closing Event...Tells us to Keep Praying for Abortion Workers!

Last night, I felt WE were the "Teal Fish"! ACTION ALERT: Stop House Bill 26: The Reproductive Freedom Act

Radical pro-abortion legislators have introduced House Bill 26, a dangerous piece of legislation that would completely dismantle Pennsylvania's longstanding protections for the unborn and rewrite our laws to promote even more widespread abortion. This bill is extreme, it ignores common-sense regulations and it endangers vulnerable mothers and children.

What HB 26 Would Do:

- Repeal Pennsylvania's Abortion Control Act, thereby eliminating decades of pro-life protections.
- End parental consent requirements allowing minors to obtain invasive abortions without a parent's knowledge.
- Eliminate informed consent by removing the 24 -hour waiting period and preventing some patients from obtaining critical health information before an abortion.
- Allow non-physicians to perform abortions expanding already dangerous abortion procedures beyond doctors to nurse practitioners and physician assistants.
- Legalize late-term abortion for "mental health" reasons a vague standard that has been exploited in other states to remove any time limits on abortion.
- Permit telemedicine chemical abortions, which eliminates in-person medical evaluations, ultrasounds, and other basic health safeguards.
- Remove Born-Alive protections, denying medical care to babies who survive botched abortions.
- Permit taxpayer-funded abortions, forcing Pennsylvanians to pay for elective abortion procedures.

HB 26 represents a complete shift in Pennsylvania law. It would move abortion regulations from the

Crimes Code to the Health and Welfare Code, doubling down on the lie that abortion is "health care" instead of revealing what it truly is: the taking of an innocent life. Furthermore, this bill criminalizes prolife counseling by making it a felony offense to "coerce" a woman into keeping her baby — another vague standard that could easily be used to silence pastors, pregnancy resource centers, and even family members.

This bill is radical, reckless, and completely out of step with Pennsylvania values.

PA Family recently reported this tragic story (*linked above*) about a teenage girl who was late in her pregnancy when she took the abortion pills that she ordered online. She ended up delivering a fully formed baby (still alive), which she kept in a box under her bed, before burying in the backyard.

Although terribly tragic, we shouldn't be surprised that the deregulation of dangerous abortion pills Mifepristone and Misoprostol, is now causing many teens and young adults to endure the horrific experience of delivering their dead or dying babies alone. How tempting would it be, to a teen who doesn't want anyone to know that she is pregnant...and is told that she can simply take a pill and her problem will go away? A young girl who knows nothing about fetal development or her cycle, and does not know how far along her pregnancy is, takes a pill that comes in the mail. This is a recipe for disaster on a massive scale, since two-thirds of all abortions are now done this way.

Let's pray and work to make sure these dangerous drugs are outlawed in Pennsylvania and everywhere!
